A group of our friends were gathered for breakfast while on vacation recently and we started discussing church related stuff. We all go to different churches in the far reaches of Berks County. I offered a story or two but more importantly I heard what these folks were saying. From those conversations I'd like to offer some thoughts & words of thanks about our situation at St Paul's in Fleetwood We are......

- Blessed to have a wonderful mix of young and old folks, those new to our congregation and those who have been lifelong members. Many churches haven't seen new members in years.
- Blessed to have a Sunday School which has children and adults attending. Many do not.
- Blessed to have a youth ministry which is led by someone ordained and inspired. Many do not.
- Blessed to have an organist who is not temporary or transient and is truly gifted. Many long for this.
- Blessed to have a choir director who is a renowned composer and can inspire others to achieve. Many wish they had such a talent.
- Blessed to have a choir that does anthems and cantatas and sings with inspiration week after week. Many do not, and long to have this part of their service again.
- Blessed to have two pastors who are inspired ministers and who care deeply about their flock. They have been with us for over a decade. Many churches long to have only one for more than a couple years.
- Blessed by a congregation who are faithful stewards. Many congregations have a hard time predicting who will be there in 3 months
- Blessed to have ministries for neighbors near (literally next door) and far (half way around the world). This is an amazing opportunity that other churches only do through 3rd party affiliations (if at all).
- Blessed to have a community that recognizes our church as a strong resource, an enabler, a supporter, and a partner. Many churches are only remembered for weddings, baptisms & funerals.
- Blessed to be able to agree to disagree and argue and struggle to find the right middle ground because people care not necessarily because they want to control stuff.
- -Blessed to have a full kitchen with people that love to prepare for the masses and do so without being told to do so! This is a function other churches are resolved to pay for.

So you might ask, why take the time to write this? We (like most) focus on our faults, our weaknesses, our shortcomings, our differences, things that get us "steamed". If we spent the time & energy uplifting our positives and focusing on those attributes what would that same energy yield?

While attending a festival in a coastal Carolina town, I was talking with an elderly native lady and she was bemoaning the blight in her city (Wilmington, NC). We started talking about the charm and potential of the historic district and how little by little, house by house folks were fighting the blight with sweat, equity, and creativity. I relayed to her a little about the transformation of West Reading - a victim of the downfall of the outlet stores - which is now thriving. She described her portion of the city, which had an influx of young professionals and artists and the efforts they were making to improve things little by little. Then she paused, looked across the crowded street in front of us and said "your right... it's not as bad as I thought. Thanks for helping me see that". And as she walked away a light bulb went on in my head & I thought to myself "yes Thank YOU for helping ME to see that too".
