Some things you should know...

- **Consistory Meetings moved to the Social Room.**

Beginning with our meeting on February 12 at 7PM, Consistory Meetings will be held in the social room. The proposed agenda will be printed in the bulletin and posted on this board for 2 Sundays prior to the meeting for congregation review.

- **Website Redesign.** Tyler Lance, Jenn Hoffman and Pastor John Folk are working together to begin the process of updating and upgrading the church website with a relaunch targeted for June 2018. Look for information and progress updates here.

- **Staff ListServe.** To promote communication throughout the organization of St. Paul's UCC, a staff email listserve has been created as well as a central calendar.

- **Committee Leadership Meeting.** The first committee leadership meeting was convened on Sat. February 4 to promote sharing of ideas and support the development of leadership in the committees that do the work that is the face of our vision here at St. Paul's UCC.

- **Storage Clean Out!** A great inventory and organization event has begun. Anyone storing anything for any purpose in the church is asked to locate, organize and carefully consider their storage needs. The PURGE will happen as part of spring cleaning efforts. We are reorganizing and reallocating.

- **No-Cook Sundays.** Beginning on March 1st, Communion Sundays will become No-Cook Sundays when we offer take-out chicken dinners to be purchased and enjoyed at home after the service. The first event will benefit the adult mission trip to Ghana. Additional information and pre-order opportunities will be available on the website and in the Narthex. February 4, 2018

- **Mission Fair.** Repeated discussions have identified the desire to reconvene a Mission Fair for our church community. Suggestions and recommendations are being discussed.

- **Church Directory.** The Guild is coordinating efforts to produce a new church directory. We intend to use this process to verify and develop our church membership. Look for mailings and additional information in the next few weeks.

- **New Cleaning Staff.** Clean Image, Inc. has taken charge of maintaining our church building. You may notice a little extra shine here and there as they have taken over the weekly cleaning process. It's a tough job, but they are working through the building with recommendations and service upgrades.

- **Heating System Review.** In response to fluctuations in reported room temperatures, the Property Committee is testing and tracking temperatures. Please do not make adjustments to thermostats as we are gathering data.
